

In FY 20/21, Colorado collected \$426.3M in marijuana tax revenue.  
The revenue was divided as follows:



**\$203M (47.6%)**

was credited to the Marijuana Tax Cash Fund and made available for appropriation for a variety of purposes.

**\$153.6M\* (36%)**

was allocated to three funds that support K-12 education, including \$120.8 million in excise taxes and \$32.9 million originating as special sales taxes.

**\$40.6M (9.5%)**

was distributed to local governments that allow retail sales.

**\$29M (6.8%)**

was retained in the General Fund.
